## **Two World-Renowned Keynote Speakers**



#### Dr. Christina Grozinger, Distinguished Professor of Entomology; Director, Center for Pollinator Research, Penn State University

Christina Grozinger is Distinguished Professor of Entomology and the Director for the Center for Pollinator Research at Penn State, and a Fellow of the Entomological Society of America. Grozinger uses an integrative approach - from genomics to ecology - to study health and social behavior in bees. Together with other members of the Center for Pollinator Research, she is developing comprehensive approaches to improve pollinator health and reduce declines, and coordinates networks of researchers, stakeholders, educators and policymakers to address these issues



#### Dr. Lynn Dicks, NERC Research Fellow; School of Biological Sciences, University of East Anglia, England

Lynn Dicks is an internationally-respected scientist and currently a NERC Research Fellow at the University of East Anglia, UK focused on bee ecology and conservation. She is part of UK- and Europe-wide projects addressing bee conservation in farmland, and has significant experience presenting research to legislators to inform policy decisions. Dicks was a recipient of the 2017 John Spedan Lewis Medal for contribution to insect conservation.
